- Teach Algebra 1, Geometry, and Algebra 2 to students that require additional support in the classroom, utilizing research-based strategies and instructional techniques.
- Act as a case manager and advocate for students with diagnosed exceptionalities.
- Teach organizational and time management skills to a select group of students in a classroom setting.
- Provide executive function coaching on an individual basis or in a small group.
