QUALIFICATIONS:

- Master's degree in Fine Arts, Studio Arts.
- Master's degree in Education, Curriculum and Instruction, or relevant field is a plus.
- Minimum of 5 years teaching experience in the visual arts, preferably in a secondary education setting.
- Demonstrated leadership experience, such as departmental leadership roles or committee membership.
- Strong understanding of 6-12 (and ideally K-12) curriculum development, pedagogical practices, and assessment strategies.
- Experience with faculty mentorship, coaching, or evaluation processes.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills, with the ability to collaborate effectively with diverse stakeholders.
- Commitment to promoting diversity, equity, and inclusion in the curriculum and school community.
- Proficiency in educational technology and learning management systems.
- Organizational skills with the ability to manage multiple tasks and priorities effectively across multiple divisions.
- Familiarity with budget management and facility coordination is preferred.
- Flexibility and adaptability to meet the evolving needs of the department and school community.
- In addition to honor and character, commitment to intellectual engagement, and appreciation for stewardship and sustainability, especially important is the candidate's ease with diverse constituencies and demonstrated commitment to an inclusive school community.
